



Nature in your neighbourhood

The Edinburgh Living Landscape is a partnership project between the Scottish Wildlife Trust, City of Edinburgh Council, Edinburgh & Lothians Greenspace Trust, Royal Botanic Gardens Edinburgh and Green Surge. It will create, restore and connect green areas of the city to make attractive and biodiverse landscapes that are enjoyed by residents and visitors. Landscapes will be healthy, nature rich and resilient to climate change.

How a Living Landscape will look

For parks and greenspaces, Edinburgh Living Landscape will mean changes to how some of our outdoor spaces will look.

The project involves a range of measures such as:

- creation of floral meadows;
- reducing how often some areas of grass are cut and allowing natural grassland to thrive;
- mowing pathways through areas of longer grass so they can still be explored and enjoyed;
- tree planting and creating woodlands; and
- increasing our use of herbaceous perennial planting.
