#### LOVE PARKS WEEK LOVES BEARS

The Week was also celebrated with the launch of a new Geocache Trail. Since the launch there have been an average of 10 geocachers per day coming to Saughton. Geocaching is a sort of high tech treasure hunt using a handheld GPS or GPS enabled phone. The committee will now be taking forward a range of ideas and volunteer tasks for the project:

- Carrying out Visitor Survey interviews and Visitor Observation studies to inform the master plan
- Holding a competition for Edinburgh Art College students to design a logo and branding for the FofSP
- Organising a celebratory event in the park in September or October to raise awareness of the project and to recruit new members.

# **GET GARDENING, GET FIT**

We are currently developing volunteering opportunities within the Garden and have one volunteer, Helen Graham, who is working one day a week with the gardeners. Also on the gardening theme, Pete has been working with <u>T om orr ow's People</u> with a view to having trainees aged 16-24 carry out some work in the Garden as part of their employability programme. This could see up to 14 young people from difficult backgrounds gain useful skills which will stand them in good stead on their journey towards employment. We'll let you know how that goes.

To be able to garden you need tools. A new initiative saw the HMP Edinburgh's Tool Shed Project donating a lot of useful gardening tools to the Friends of Saughton Park. The <u>Tool</u> <u>Shed Project</u> is a scheme where prisoners renovate and repair donated tools which are then distributed to community projects. Saughton Park will become an official local collection points for donated tools. We'll let you know later where to go if you have old tools to donate.
