CONSULTATION FEVER AND ELUSIVE BEARS

Thank you to everyone who took the time to come along to one of the consultation events and give their feedback on the design proposals. We are still analysing the data but an initial review has shown overwhelming support for all aspects of the designs with many of you providing positive comments.

The Spring Fever and Easter Bear Hunt events were hugely successful, with around 100 and 600 people respectively attending them. Many thanks to the Friends of Saughton Park who did a grand trade in teas and cakes and to Pete and Catherine who put up and took down all the exhibitions, staffed the events and spread the word far and wide.

Also a big thanks to the Caley and the Council's Inch Nursery for all the Spring Fever activities and plant sales and to those who helped to make the Easter Bear Hunt a big success: story tellers Gillian MacDonald and Mary Sutherland; Sainsbury who donated the prizes; and of course to the Saughton Bears, who took over Easter Bunny duties for the Easter Bear Hunt.

HLF REVIEW SUCCESS

In March the HLF carried out a formal review of our master plan proposals and I'm happy to report that they were very well received and the HLF granted us a pass, which is great news for the project.

This means we can now move on to the more detailed design work. While the overall proposals which we consulted on will not change significantly, we will drill down to the more detailed considerations such as making sure the layout of the café functions well for café operators and the floral displays can be easily maintained.

WE SEEK APPROVAL

We are taking a report to the Transport and Environment Committee on 2 June. This report outlines the process followed in developing the master plan proposals for Saughton Park and Gardens, and seeks the Committee's approval to submit a second round bid application to the Heritage Lottery Fund by deadline 1 September.

This is an important part of the Council's approval process and we'll let you know the outcome following the Committee meeting in June.

FRIENDS ANNOUNCE WINNING LOGO DESIGN

The Friends group have had a busy time over the past few months. As mentioned above, they have been invaluable in supporting the consultation events. They have had volunteers helping out as some of the staffed exhibitions and of course they have provided refreshments at the two key consultation events in March and April.

They recently ran a competition for Edinburgh College of Art students to design their new Friends of Saughton Park logo. They received 22 high quality designs and made their selection at their meeting on 5 March. Their decision was unanimous, and we congratulate Clare Robertson who designed the winning logo.

In February their History Group met and were treated to a viewing of an album of platinum photographic prints which portrayed the participants of the Pageant of Scottish Allegory and Myth which was performed twice at 1908 Scottish National Exhibition at Saughton Park.

Dr Elizabeth Cumming gave a fascinating insight into this amazing event which saw around 2000 performers, many of whom were the illuminati of the Scottish Arts and Crafts Movement Celtic Revival, and which included Phoebe Traquair and Cecile Walton amongst their ranks.

Looking ahead, the Friends will have a stand at the Balgreen Primary School Fair on Saturday 6 June and the Saughtonhall Recreation Ground Summer Fair on Sunday 14 June, when the focus will be on recruiting new members.

The next Friends of Meeting is on 4 June at 7 pm at Saughton Park Winter Garden, everyone welcome.

BRING BACK THE BANDSTAND FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN

We are about to launch a fund raising campaign to raise the last bit of matched funding we require for our HLF bid. In summary, we are bidding for 70% of the overall project costs and need to secure matched funding of 30% before we submit our bid at the end of August. Without this, the bid will not be as competitive against other bids and this adds to the risk of the HLF not granting the funding we need to protect and restore this important historic park.

We have identified where we will get the majority of this matched funding, mainly through the Council capital budget programme and volunteer in-time contributions. However we still need to secure £200,000.

Our fundraising campaign will focus on the bringing the historic bandstand back to life.



The Saughton Bandstand is a Lion Foundry of Kilwinning No.23 Model and being one of only five of this type left in the entire world it is of national significance and will be the only cast iron band stand in Edinburgh. Locally, it is firmly embedded in the hearts and minds of generations of Saughton Park users and to bring it back into the park and into use would be hugely popular.
