Spring is finally here and the park is looking great. We have been busy getting the project restarted following the great news about our HLF funding, and developing outline proposals for the playground at Saughton Park. Read on to find out more.

PLAYTIME AT SAUGHTON

We have been working with Ironside Farrar Ltd to develop concept proposals for the Saughton Park Playground.



During the public consultation on the whole park last year, many of you gave us your views on the playground. Just over half (58.2%) of you who took park believed the playground was good or very good meaning that just under half of you felt the playground was below par. Three quarters of respondents (76.7%) felt that the playground should be enlarged. Some of your suggestions included facilities for children with disabilities, greater provision for under 5's and more adventurous play and natural play.

Taking your feedback into account we have developed outline proposals which aim to provide enhanced play opportunities for children of different ages and abilities, with a strong focus on making the playground more inclusive and accessible for all to enjoy.

The proposals include an accessible path system to make it easier for pushing baby buggies and for those in wheelchairs or who experience mobility difficulties. Certain wheelchair accessible equipment, such as see-saws, trampolines, roundabouts and sand tables, and equipment which can be used by children who require a bit more help, such as basket swings, boat swings and Dutch discs, have been included to ensure that children of differing abilities and needs can play and have fun together.

Musical and other sensory equipment will delight everyone while mounding, bridges and tunnels will provide a sense of adventure and exploration for children. Sand and water play will add to the sensory experience and equipment such as trampolines, spinning bowls and jumping springs will add extra fun and laughter.

Toddlers will have 'mini' units and bigger kids will be able to climb, swing and spin higher and faster ...and scare themselves silly!! Benches, flowers, trees, picnic areas and a planted windbreak will benefit everyone and we're sure will be much appreciated by the adults!!

Funding needs to be secured for making these improvements and bid applications will be prepared once the designs have been finalised and costed. But first, we need your feedback to allow us to complete the proposals.

MAKING THE WALLS SAFE

Over the next few weeks you'll notice work taking place around the Walled Garden. This is to repair and make safe the historic walls. You may have noticed that ivy has already been removed to allow the walls to be assessed.

The work involved will include removing a sycamore tree from the corner of the walled garden where the tree roots are making the walls unstable. Separate to this, one of the limes in this area of the garden is diseased and has to be removed. It is intended that new limes will be planted to replace this and the sycamore.

More tree works will be taking place around the park to remove diseased trees and a few poor quality trees which will improve sight lines and increase the biodiversity of the understory. Maintenance will include crown lifting and shrub clearance to open up views and allow more light to get in.
