We hope to date that our activities have not caused too much disruption and would like to thank you, the community for your patience and understanding during these essential demolition works.

We promised to keep you informed of essential works and advise you of any potential disruption due to noisy activities on site.

Piling Works Update

As we intimated in our previous newsletter the foundation works for the new Sports Centre are due commence this month.

We propose to carry out these works in 2 phases over a period of 4 weeks; the first of these commencing 25th March and the second from around 10th April 19.

The aim is to minimise the duration of the initial phase works by employing 2 piling rigs, and operating Monday-Friday from 8.00am to 6.00pm.

We appreciate that these essential works are noisy and whilst our aim to keep this to a minimum, we would like to take this opportunity to apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused during this time. Noise and vibration monitors will be set up during these works.

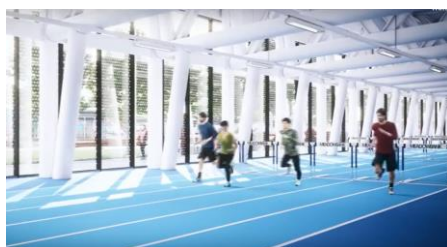
Community Engagement
