

Green Pencil Award 2024

Eligibility and judging criteria

Eligibility

- The competition is open to pupils in P4 to S3 attending an Edinburgh school, or to home-educated children in this age group living in Edinburgh.
- Entries should be on the 2024 Theme Edinburgh 900
- Children can write in any form with the following length restrictions: stories and poems should be no longer than one side of A4 paper.
- Entries are restricted to one entry per pupil and all entries must be accompanied by an entry form.
- Entries must be received in either an Edinburgh Library or sent, clearly marked 'Green Pencil Award', to

Awards

- One of the 20 finalists will be selected as the overall award winner and be awarded the Green Pencil Award trophy and winner's medal.
- The Green Pencil Award trophy must be returned after one year.

Judging criteria

- The judging panel will be drawn from Council staff from Libraries, Eco Schools and Literacy as well as sponsors and partners.
- Judging will be fair and unbiased: judges will declare any potential conflict of interest e.g. family relationship with entrants
- The judges' decision is final, and no individual correspondence can be entered into.
- Judges are unable to comment on individual entries.
- Entries will be judged on the quality and impact of the writing, originality, the use of language and engagement with the theme.
- Entries will not be penalised or corrected for spelling or grammatical inaccuracies where the meaning is clear.
- Any design included with the entry will not influence the judges: it is the writing that is judged.
