1. Overview

This document details the conformance of the Idox Public Access 3.x product to the World Wide Web Consortium (W3C) [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines \(WCAG\) 2.1](#).

*“WCAG 2.0 and WCAG 2.1 are stable, referenceable technical standards.
They have 12-13 guidelines that are organized under 4 principles:
perceivable, operable, understandable, and robust.*

*For each guideline, there are testable success criteria, which are at three levels:
A, AA, and AAA.” [\[Source\]](#)*

How does Public Access conform?

Public Access has been built using best practices and standards as defined by WCAG 2.1 and conforms to, at least, the relevant success criteria of WCAG 2.1 level AA in-line with current [UK Government requirements](#).

Here is a short list of some of the accessible features presented by Public Access:

- Clear page titles for better orientation.
- Alternative text detail for images (“alt text”) and other non-text elements.
- Consistent and clear use of headings including a semantic hierarchy (as far as possible).
- Association of form controls with labels.
- Clear form error messages in proximity to erroneous form fields.
- Association of all data cells in a data table with their headers.
- Meaningful text for hyperlinks (and a title attribute, where applicable).
- Forms follow a logical order and can be navigated using a keyboard (e.g. Tab key to move between fields).
- Sufficient foreground and background colour contrast combinations.
- Keyboard navigation for menus and calendar controls.
