

The City of Edinburgh Council (Various Streets, Corstorphine) (Experimental Traffic Management Measures) (No.1) Modification Order 2023 - ETRO/21/21

On 24/5/23 The City of Edinburgh Council gave notice that it had made The City of Edinburgh Council (Various Streets, Corstorphine) (Experimental Traffic Management Measures) (No 1) Experimental Order 2023 that introduced various restrictions in the Corstorphine area pursuant to sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Pursuant to Article 9 of the Order and section 10 (2) of the Act the Council now gives notice that it has on 21/12/23, modified the Order by: (1) Removal from Schedule 2, the item Manse Rd (east side) from a point 14m or thereby south of the extended southern kerbline of Featherhall Terr for a distance of 26m or thereby northwards and (2) amending Schedule 7 so as to change the school street restriction times for Carrick Knowe and Corstorphine Primary schools to reduce the restriction times in the morning from 8:00-10:00 to 8:00-9:30 (Mon-Fri). These changes will come into operation on 8/1/24. Details of the made Order, the amendments and all related documents, including our privacy notice, can be viewed free of charge either at Waverley Court Reception between 9:30 & 15:30 Mon-Fri, or online from 8/1/24 to 7/7/24 at www.edinburgh.gov.uk/trafficorders or www.tellmescotland.gov.uk. The Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person may object to the making of the Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation. As the Order has been modified the objection period is extended, objections should state the name and address of the objector, the matters to which they relate and the grounds on which they are made, in writing quoting reference ETRO/21/21, to Traffic Orders, Place, Waverley Court, 4 East Market St, Edinburgh, EH8 8BG, or by email to Edinburgh.Consultation@projectcentre.co.uk, not later than 7/7/24. Responses should state your name and address and the matters to which they relate. If you are responding to this consultation and your comments relate to any particular location/s or element/s of the proposals, it would be helpful if you could identify those in your response. Should this Order be varied by another experimental order or otherwise modified, there will be a further period of six months during which objections will be invited, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force.
