Integrated Impact Assessment – Summary Report

1. Title of proposal

To consider the potential impact of not renewing contract (CM2988) between the City of Edinburgh Council (CEC) and Mind of My Own Ltd (MOMO), which is coming to a natural end on the 17th of September 2023.

2. What will change as a result of this proposal?

On the 12th of May 2023, formal notification was issued of CEC's intention not to renew the contract. As a result, care experienced children and young people in Edinburgh will no longer have access to MOMO accounts. Around 20% of children currently working with Childrens Social Work Services have an account. Collective attention to turn to developing or procuring a new, more effective, system or tool for seeking and capturing views and feedback from the children and young people who use our services.

- **3. Briefly describe public involvement in this proposal to date and planned** No public involvement to date. However, decisions made as a result of this proposal will need to be communicated to staff, children and young people and partners.

The contract with Mind of My Own will come to a natural end in September '23. It is recommended that senior management issue communication to social work staff in relation to their proposal to replace MOMO. Any child or young person who engages with CEC social services will already have a dedicated worker who will be able to communicate any changes to the child or young person in a manner most suited to the individual. CYP's voice, worries and opinions will still be listened to and documented in Swift through means more popular than MOMO (e.g. over text/call, in person conversation).
