Where does the Council's income come from?

The Council's budget for 2024/25 is £1,344.7 million. Council Tax funds 26.5% (£355.9 million) of this with 43.3% coming from Government Grants and 30.2% from Non-Domestic Rates. The sum of £1,344.7 million is based on the combined level of external grant funding included in Finance Circular 2/2024 prior to the confirmation of sums to be provided in respect of freezing Council Tax at 2023/24 levels.

Comparison with Government provision for planned spending

The expenditure figure for the Council used by the Scottish Government in Aggregate External Finance (Total Central Government Support) calculations is £1,203.143m, which provides for a spend of £4,563 per dwelling. The Council's budget provides for a spend of £4,791 per dwelling.
