Pursuant to Article 9 of the Order and section 10 (2) of the Act the Council now gives notice that it has on 14/8/24, modified the Order to amend the Prohibition of Motor Vehicles operational period on West Shore Road to now operate from 16/8/24 to 14/1/26. This change will come into operation on the 16/8/24. The Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person may object to the making of the Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation. As the Order has been modified the objection period is extended. Should this Order be varied by another experimental order or otherwise modified, there will be a further period of six months during which objections will be invited, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force.
