Localised Work Sites

The planting of new trees, plants and grass is taking place during November 2023 to tie in with the planting season.

Small sections of surfacing are continuing.

Construction Updates

Newhaven to Leith Walk

Newhaven to Melrose Drive

Further street lighting has been installed in the area with additional works required by a specialist sub-contractor. These are scheduled to be completed w/c 27 November 2023.



Melrose Drive

Soft landscaping will take place during November 2023.

Ocean Terminal

There are small sections of hard and soft landscaping continuing in this area.

Stevedore Place

There are outstanding works scheduled to take place at the west entrance of Stevedore Place.



Constitution Place to Baltic Street

Please note vehicles are not permitted to turn right from Constitution Street into Bernard Street .

Bernard / Baltic Street

The five trees have now been planted and the protective fencing will be removed.

Outstanding work is the creation of a bin store to the west of the bus stop.

Leith Walk

Cycle Lane

There are collapsed utility covers at Gayfield Square, Elm Row, and Pilrig Church which require further works. These works are being undertaken by a utility company.

Once complete, the cycleways on both sides of Leith Walk will formally open.

Cycle diversion routes remain in place to facilitate these works.

Manhole covers

Works on certain loose manhole covers are scheduled to be completed in the coming weeks.

Foot of the Walk to Pilrig Street

Further signage and the creation of a yellow box junction at the Leith Walk / Great Junction Street / Duke Street junction are scheduled to take place over the coming weeks. These works will take place out of hours.

Scottish Water are undertaking works at Dalmeny Street (repairs to deal with flooding issues).



Pilrig Street to Annandale Street / Montgomery Street / Elm Row

Scottish Water are continuing works at Albert Street. [Full details of the works that are being undertaken can be found on the Scottish Water website.](#)

The Brunswick Street / Leith Walk junction remains closed until further notice.

Elm Row is now fully open. The small section of lighting works has been completed by a specialist sub-contractor and fencing has been removed.

Lining and signage works by a specialist sub-contractor are still outstanding.

There are outstanding surfacing works to take place on Montgomery Street. A programme for this is being developed.

London Road to York Place

The damage to the island site on London Road to the north of the junction with Royal Terrace is being reviewed by the City of Edinburgh Council.
